Long famed for its love affair with the automobile. America is starting to rekindle an interest in the railroad.

The biggest sign of this is the Brightline, a fast speed rail network operating in Florida and. Their latest addition is the route between Miami and Orlando, promising to whisk you there in only 3.5 hours. The atrium resembles Eurostar, only bigger yet calmer, with gleaming screens and signs.

SENSORY-FRIENDLY MUSEUMS AND ATTRACTIONS

Superblue Miami

Art and technology combined can create something very powerful. This is the lesson visitors take away from a visit to Superblue Miami, an immersive, one-of-a-kind art experience in Allapattah. This 50,000-square-foot gallery demonstrates how technology may become a tool to realize the imaginations of artists.

Sensory-Friendly Features

This immersive experience can be overwhelming for neurotypical viewers, so Superblue has accommodations available every day as well as special Sensory Friendly Sessions on the third Thursday of every month. On those third Thursdays, the attraction opens at 10 a.m. – an hour earlier than usual – to welcome guests who have sensory sensitivities or other reasons they would be more comfortable in a quiet, modified setting. The number of guests is lower than normal, and sounds and lights are adjusted. Tickets for the **Sensory Friendly Sessions** should be bought online in advance. The sessions end at 11 a.m., when regular operating hours begin.

Every day, Superblue offers quiet spaces for guests who want a break. Visitors can also request sensory kits with earplugs and sunglasses to lessen sounds and lights.

A Bilingual Sensory Kit can be downloaded in advance so families can review together what to expect on their visit. Inside, you'll find a social narrative in English and Spanish. The University of Miami-Nova Southeastern Center for Autism and Related Disabilities recognizes Superblue Miami as an Autism Friendly Partner.

Miami Children's Museum

The expansive Miami Children's Museum on Watson Island, just east of Downtown Miami, is beloved for its family-focused interactive exhibits and excellent programs. In an entertaining way, it teaches kids about the arts, culture and the community.

Sensory-Friendly Features

Miami Children's Museum has a Multi-Sensory/Snoezelen Room, where visitors can have a specially designed multisensory experience anytime with reduced lighting.

The whole museum is adjusted, however, on free Sensory Friendly Saturday on the second Saturday of each month, when the museum is modified to be a more comfortable and supportive environment for children with autism and other sensoryprocessing disorders. The museum's lights are dimmed, sound volumes are lowered, the number of visitors is restricted and quiet spaces are available where children can take a break when needed. There are also special activities and programs designed for children with autism, including a sensory-friendly stage performance.

Admission to Sensory Friendly Saturday is free, but RSVP is required; registration closes at 5 p.m. the Friday before each event.

Miami is paying homage to Black culture in numerous ways, making it a busy June lineup in The Magic City. The Juneteenth Pride Celebration is recognizing the triumphs and challenges of the Black LGBTQ+ community on Friday, June 14 at the Miami Beach Botanical Garden. The fourth annual Juneteenth Freedom Day Celebration on Saturday, June 15 is a free, family-friendly event hosted by Florida International University. The lawnchair-friendly afternoon will offer live performances, artisan vendors, entertaining dancers, and food trucks. The 4th Annual Juneteenth Park-In & Party Celebration also takes place on June 15 in Miami Gardens.

In Miami fashion, a family-friendly beach bash is happening at Historic Virginia Key Beach Park on Saturday, June 22. Activities include face painting, educational activities, a petting zoo, raffles, free food and drinks, live music, bounce houses, and more. Other events in the city include the Juneteenth Comedy Show, a theatrical production titled "The Juneteenth Experience," and the Juneteenth Black Futurism Environmental Summit.
